
# This is messy:




## Reading the CAS Standards

- Visit:
  - Use four questions as a guide
  - Skip around
  - Skim around
- Read it from cover to cover:
  - Annotate
  - Write down ideas for your unit separately or as part of your margin notes.
- Be a good student:
  - Use reading strategies MURDER (the M stands for Mood)
  - Be metacognitive sticky notes and pencils, not highlighters!
